

DECLARATION FOR A PENSION.

WAR OF 1812.

STATE OF NEW YORK,

COUNTY OF Herkimer } ss.

On this Nineteen day of September A. D., one thousand eight hundred and seventy one, personally appeared before me, Douglas Bennett ~~County Clerk~~ Prescott County Judge of the County of Herkimer a Court of Record within and for the County and State aforesaid, Michael Hartman aged 78 years, a resident of Mohawk County of Herkimer and State of New York who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is married, that his wife's name was Elizabeth Shoemaker to whom he was married at Germanflats on the 22 day of August 1816 that he served the full period of sixty days in the (1) Military service of the United States in the war of 1812, that he is the identical Michael Hartman who (2) enlisted in Captain Nicholas Shoemaker Company, Regiment Brigade Division, at Germanflats the 15 day of May, 1814, and was honorably discharged at Sackett's Harbor on the 15 day of December 1814, that (3) was a Private under Capt Nicholas Shoemaker and was on duty seventy days

That he at no time during the late rebellion against the authority United States, adhered to the cause of enemies of the Government, giving them aid or comfort; or exercised the functions of any office whatever under any authority, or pretended authority, in hostility to the United States; that he will support the constitution of the United States; that he is not in receipt of a pension and that he will support that he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States, under the provision of the act approved February 14th, 1871, and he hereby constitutes and appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, **C. S. TITUS & CO.**, of **ALBANY, N. Y.**, his true and lawful attorneys to prosecute his claim and obtain the pension certificate that may be issued; that his post office is at Mohawk County of Herkimer, State of New York; that his domicile or place of abode is Mohawk N. Y.

To Mr. Michael Hartman Greeting:

You having been elected a Sergeant of a Company, under the command of Francis C. Spinner in the Twenty Sixth Regiment Fifth Brigade, and Third Division of Artillery of the Militia of the State of New-York:—I do therefore, in pur-

suance of the statute in such case made and provided, **Grant you this Warrant.**—You are to obey the orders which you shall, from time to time, receive from your superior officers, and to discharge the duty of Sergeant in said Company, with fidelity, according to the laws and regulations established for the government and discipline of the Militia of this State.
