

HENRY HOARD

S.C. 24704

You are furnished herein the record of Henry Hoard as found in claim for pension, S.C. 24704, based upon his service in the War of 1812.

Henry Hoard was born in Stephentown, Rensselaer County, New York; the date of his birth and the names of parents are not stated.

Henry Hoard volunteered at Buffalo, or at Sheldon, New York, and served from the last of August or first of September, 1814, fifteen days as private in captain Guerdon Hurlburth's and Lemuel Castle's companies, in the New York troops, stationed on the Niagara Frontier.

On account of his service in the War of 1818, Henry Hoard applied May 1, 1858, for bounty land, while residing in Sheldon, Wyoming County, New York. On this application, Warrant No. 90253, for one hundred sixty acres of bounty land was issued to him, under the Act of March 3, 1856. In 1859, he was still living in Sheldon, New York.

On account of his service in the War of 1812, Henry Hoard was allowed pension, also, on his application executed June 3, 1878, at which time he was aged eighty-six years and a resident of Sheldon, Wyoming County, New York, with post office at Varysburg in that county.

No reference was made in the claim to soldier's wife, but reference was made to his sons and daughters, no names given, nor any details in regard to them.
